




## Launched in 2010, Map Search - an hList enhancement, the new way to find affordable rental housing in Minnesota.

### Q. What does Map Search do that makes a difference?

### A. It gives people control of their housing search.

Sometimes knowing the city a renter wants to live in isn't enough. Sometimes they want to live in a specific neighborhood, near where he or she works, close to family and friends, in proximity to medical care, or other places of importance. Map Search gives renters that control. Using the *Google* search bar at the bottom of the map, a renter can enter an address or landmark near where they want to live. The map readjusts and zooms in to that area and shows nearby housing that is currently available. Just like that, a renter has control to find the housing they want and need. Adding this feature in 2010 has changed the way people search for affordable rental housing in Minnesota.

# Helping Renters Locate Affordable Housing

Getting low-to-moderate income renters the information they need when they need it is what makes housinglink.org successful. The following is how renters used our website in 2010 to locate safe, stable, affordable housing:

### hList

Each month more than 2,700 housing and waiting list openings were advertised. Renters and case managers searched a wide variety of listings on hList using an interactive map. The unique map search function, launched in 2010, helped them find housing near employment, family, and other places of importance.

For individuals with the lowest incomes, knowing when a subsidized housing waiting list opens is of vital importance. We have taken the time-consuming nature out of this type of search by centralizing all waiting list information on our website. This is a favorite place to stop for both renters & case managers! ### **Accessible Housing**

For those with disabilities it is a challenge to find affordable rental housing that accommodates their unique needs. We've addressed this by making it easy to search for housing with accessibility features. No-step approaches, roll-in showers, grab bars, and more are identified in property listings.

### **Vacancies Filled Faster**

With over 1,150 searches on housinglink.org every day in 2010, posting a listing generated traffic that filled vacancies and waiting lists faster.

### **Free Advertising**

Since HousingLink's inception landlords have always had a free advertising opportunity on our website. Keeping it free means more landlord participation and a greater variety of housing for renters to choose from. In 2010, with the internet as the main way to search for housing, landlords got a better return on investment and renters found quality places to live.

### **Easy to Use Online Account**

All property information and photos are saved in the property manager's online account. In the economy we endured in 2010 many renters needed housing fast due to a housing crisis. Allowing landlords to save their information ensured that available listings got to renters faster.

# Insightful Research

HousingLink keeps the community current with relevant housing information. Foreclosure, affordable housing production and preservation, and affordable housing opportunities for low-income renters are three things we kept an eye on in 2010.

### **Foreclosure Reports**

Using sheriff sale data we tracked what happened in the foreclosure crisis. This helped the community determine how to respond and help those in foreclosure. \$112 million in neighborhood stabilization and foreclosure mitigation dollars were brought to Minnesota partly due to our research & data.

### **Housing Counts**

Housing Counts, an annual report released for the seventh time in 2010, reveals affordable housing production and preservation in the Twin Cities. When new units of affordable housing are constructed, or if affordable housing units are lost, it is revealed in this report.

### hSum

This annual report identifies the gap between available subsidized housing units and the total number of people earning less than 30% of the area median income. Our report released in 2010 revealed that subsidized rental opportunities exist for 33% of households that make less than 30% of the area median income.
